born on 23 July 1913 at Kiev, Ukraine, Russia

Service with the Polish Forces under British Command:

Service with the Polish Resettlement Corps: Enlisted
Commissioned on 19 February 1947

relegated to: Class "W" Reserve on /.
Unemployed List finally discharged
relinquished commission on 18 February
(honourably discharged) 1949

Remarks: His record and services were satisfactory.

Former Service and History: Joined a Reserve Artillery Officer Cadets School Wlodzimierz Wolynski from 19.9.1933 to 20.9.1934 and then an Artillery Officer Cadets School Torun from 1.10.1934 to 15.10.1936. Officer of the 4 Battery, 19 Field Artillery Regiment Molodeczno from 15.10.1936 to 6.10.1939. Took part in the campaign in Poland from 1.9.1939 to 6.10.1939 when captured and held prisoner by the Germans at the Battle for Kock. At the Prisoner of War Transit Camps (Radom, Kielce, Stargard) from 6.10.39 to 6.11.1939. Transferred to Oflag II B Arnswalde and Oflag II D Gross-Born 6.11.1939 to 28.1.1945. Evacuated to Stalag X B Sandbostel 28.1.1945 to 20.3.1945. Liberated by the Allies on 29.4.1945. At the Military Centres Verden and Delmenhorst 29.4.1945 to 2.8.1945.

Arrived at the 2nd Polish Corps Base Porto San Giorgio, Italy on 9.8.1945 and joined the Polish Forces under British command as above. Served in Italy and the United Kingdom until finally relinquished his commission. Posted to the 8 Pomorski Field Artillery Regiment and Light Aid Detachment Type "B" (re-named the 16 Pomorski Field Artillery Regiment on 28.10.1945) of the 2 Warsaw Armoured Division, 2nd Polish Corps from 10.8.1945 to 10.2.1947. Seconded to a Junior Officers Course with the 7 Mounted Artillery Regiment from 12.8.1945 to 28.10.1945. Nominated Signals Officer of the III Battery on 25.1.1946. Joined a Signals Officers Course at the Army Training Centre from 7.2.1946 to 1.4.1946. Transferred to the 7 Mounted Artillery Regiment on 11.2.1947. Commissioned 2nd Lieutenant on 15.10.1936. Completed a 2 year contract with the Polish Resettlement Corps.
